**3. San Francisco Zoo Administrative Report**

**(Discussion)**

Tanya Peterson, Executive Director and President, SFZS.

Peterson discussed the addition to SFZ's Mission statement of the 3 C's (Connect, Care, Conserve) with the component of the Strategic Plan and its 3 C's (Core, Community, Coastal).

Example presented under Core is the remodel of the Lion House with new enclosures for the animals and upgrading the exterior of the building. An example of the Community is the

Zoolights evening event which allows visitors a different evening experience at the Zoo and

Coastal is the Zoo's participation with the Coastal Conservation Zone. Zoo employees assisted in a coastal cleanup of ocean beach. The volunteers found garbage items, discarded household

items, cigarette butts, etc. along the beach and assisted with the clean-up. Peterson discussed her trip to Churchill, Manitoba in Canada to visit the polar bear holding facility. The trip included

twelve members of the Board and staff interested in the preservation and care of polar bears.

Churchill is on the migration path of these animals. They saw the holding facility, a polar bear trap as well as actual bears in the wild. The bears are a nuisance to the town of Churchill and the

need to preserve these animals is paramount. She closed with an overhead view of the proposed changes to the Great Highway and the effects this will have upon the Zoo. Commissioner Buell

asked for an update on the plans for the restoration of the Mothers Building. Peterson stated that ideas for the restoration are being discussed. Buell said he would like to have quarterly reports on

the progress. Commissioner Bonilla asked for the purpose of the trip to Churchill. Peterson said it was a trip to inform members what conditions are like and hopefully start dialogue for solutions.

**6. Aging Animals**

Jason Watters, VP Wellness & Animal Behavior, SFZS

Watters reported on the growing demographic of aging zoo animals and the practices which are currently being applied throughout zoos. The philosophy is care for the animals from the “Cradle to Grave”. A meeting of zoo professionals was held on this subject. Over 60 delegates attended the meeting which had eight speakers and nine presentations. Key areas were identified: Assessing welfare, Medical concerns, Exhibit design/modification, Social concerns and Staff support. Indicators were given citing practices being used in the care of SFZ 35 year old polar bear, Ulu. During the report period of one month the balance sheets showed positive indications in activity and motivation with Ulu. The concensus from the conference was that with the use of continuous practices and care for animals promoted longevity and increased quality of life.
