(Discussion)

Steven Haines, VP of Strategic Growth & Marketing, SFZS

Mr. Haines gave an update on administrative affairs at the Zoo, first reporting on visitor attendance for the month of March, which was 72,391 versus the budget of 70,000. Year-to-date attendance through March 31, 2017 is 621,015 versus a budget of 636,000, generating an unfavorable variance of 14,985 visitors. Haines discussed the passing of the Zoo's 36 year-old polar bear, Uulu, noting that her long life was a testament to the excellent care that she received at the Zoo. Haines reported on this month's celebration of great apes during the "APE-ri!" event as well as a recent Family Access Day held in partnership with Support for Families of Children with Disabilities. He discussed a newly published article in the Association of Zoos & Aquariums "Connect" magazine, which reported on the success of the Zoo's "Foobler" animal enrichment program with black rhino "Boone". Haines provided an update on the "Octopus Soiree" held at the Zoo in partnership with the Greater Farallones Marine Sanctuary. Haines reported on the successful Big Bunny Easter weekend celebration and the upcoming events planned for Earth Day.
