### 3. San Francisco Zoo Administrative Report (Discussion)

Tanya Peterson, Executive Director & President SFZS.

Peterson reported attendance for March is 82,648 versus budget of 62,000 and over budget by 20,648 visitors. Free admission for the month was 8,960. Actual year-to-date attendance is 689,287 and over budget by 99,287 visitors. Free admissions year-to-date is 73,966 visitors.

Peterson announced on May 10<sup>th</sup>, Mother's Day, free admission will be given to Moms who accompany their children to the Zoo. May 16 is Endangered Species Day. The Zoo will be acknowledging animals in the collection which are on the list of endangered species. As other AZA institutions are doing one exhibit of an endangered animal will be closed to demonstrate what the world would be like without this species. SFZ will be closing the Komodo dragon exhibit.

Peterson reported an update on the South American Exhibit. The remodel of the WPA Aviary building is a cost of \$6.5million. An Avian Expert for birds has been engaged by the Zoo. Eighty animals will inhabit the exhibit consisting of birds and reptiles. Hiring is being done for two Assistant Curators, Avian and Reptiles as well as job posting for new (2.5) animal keepers. Target dates are moving the animals to the new home in May and opening of the exhibit in the summer 2015.

Peterson also stated that an increase in admission prices is being considered beginning in the summer 2015. A comparison of admission prices as of March 2015 of family-friendly activities in the Bay Area was presented showing SFZ being underpriced. Current California Zoo pricing showed SFZ being the lowest in admission fees to San Diego, Los Angeles and Oakland Zoos. Peterson also gave comparisons of weekday/weekend and peak season/off season pricing.

Peterson announced that this year's Hal Markowitz Wellness Award will go to the Head of the Moor Park College. Peterson announced that Committee Advisor Stephens will be vacating her position on the Committee. She thanked her for her dedication and participation. Committee Advisor Spinelli stated it has been a great pleasure being on the Committee with Ms. Stephens.

Commissioner Bonilla questioned with the increase what is the additional revenue slated for. Peterson responded it is for general operation expenses. Bonilla asked what the revenue goal is. Reading answered that at this time SFZ is not at that level but it is the cost of doing business. Commissioner McDonnell questioned when the last increase was initiated. Reading responded

that it was two years ago. He explained that SFZ is required to give 90 day notice before implementation which this is. Figures will now be compared, examined and then the actual proposal will be presented to the Committee. McDonnell questioned how visitor input is acquired. Peterson responded that visitor surveys are conducted throughout the year as well as email and questionnaire forms being submitted.

6. **Veterinary Update on Geriatric Animals** (Information only)  
 Dr. Graham Crawford, Chief of Veterinary Services, SFZS  
 Dr. Crawford gave a presentation on SFZ geriatric program. SFZ has a large number of long-lived animals in the collection and he believes the reason for these geriatric animals is the lifelong care received. Lifelong care isn't just veterinary care but social structure, diet, environmental habitats. Dr. Crawford reviewed various geriatric animals in the collection and the care received. Conditions being treated include arthritis, heart, thyroid, colon, teeth, and general aging diseases. Secchia asked how it is known that a gorilla has a root canal problem. Crawford responded that under regular examination the mass was discovered and root canal was performed by a human dentist.
