Subject: Japantown Peace Plaza – Grant Agreement and Accept and Expend

Agenda Wording

Discussion and possible action to 1) adopt a resolution approving an application to the California Natural Resources Agency General Fund Specified Grant Program for the Japantown Peace Plaza Project in the amount of \$6,000,000; and 2) recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend the Grant for purposes of the Project; and 3) recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the General Manager to enter into an agreement with the California Natural Resources Agency to administer the Grant funds.

Strategic Plan

Strategy 1: Inspire Public Space: Keep today's parks safe, clean, and fun; promote our parks' historic and cultural heritage; and build the great parks of tomorrow.

- Objective: 1.2. Strengthen the quality of existing parks and facilities.
- Objective: 1.4. Preserve and celebrate historic and cultural resources.

Strategy 3: Inspire Investment: Through community engagement, advocacy, and partnerships, cultivate more financial resources to keep San Francisco's parks and programs accessible for all.

- Objective 3.2. Broaden engagement and strengthen external communications with park users and park partners.

Background

As part of the California State Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, Assemblymember Phil Ting secured \$6,000,000 in funding for the Japantown Peace Plaza Renovation Project through Budget Act 2022-2023. The funding will come in the form of a General Fund Specified Grant administered by the California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA). The grant performance period will be July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2026.

One of the preliminary grant requirements is to adopt a resolution to apply (Attachment 1) which delegates the authority to General Manager and their designee to conduct grant related business. Upon adoption of the resolution by the Recreation and Park Commission and approval of the grant legislation to accept and expend the grant, Department staff will prepare a project application and submit to CNRA for approval.

The project application will be based on the vision/conceptual plan approved by the Commission in August 2019 which includes the complete renovation of the plaza and its amenities, meets all ADA guidelines for accessible design and remedies the subsurface waterproofing and water intrusion deficiencies from the plaza into the two-level garage below. The scope of work is:

- Replace paving,
- Increase planting
- Increase seating (accessible, intimate, and terraced)
- Retain/replace historic-cultural elements (cherry trees, heritage monument, boulders, etc.)
- Increase lighting
- Increase usability and flexibility for events
- Improve circulation throughout the plaza
- Improve Post and Geary St entrances
- Seismically upgrade Peace Pagoda

The design team, through detailed engineering and further analysis have fine-tuned the commission approved conceptual design into the current and community supported, site plan which continues to meet the original project goals offset by the community:

- Make Post Street visually open and inviting, while mitigating wind and providing seating and shade.
- Provide a large permanent stage and seating to accommodate 200-300 people.
- Make Peace Plaza an inviting and playful space for people of all ages to discover and explore.
- Create an inviting visual expression along the Geary Boulevard edge that draws people into the plaza and mitigates noise levels from Geary Boulevard.
- Incorporate significant cultural elements included in the original design for Japantown Peace Plaza.
