




# Randolph & Bright Mini Park – Existing Condition



1992 renovation included: new accessible play structure, benches, sand play area, pressure treated railroad ties and retaining wall. San Francisco Conservation Corps assisted with the installation of the project giving opportunity to local youth.





# KABOOM! Partners with SFRPD to end playspace inequity

Through the 25 in 5 Initiative to End Playspace Inequity, KABOOM! and the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department will lead an ambitious \$10 million plan to address gaps in access to quality, nature-rich children’s playspaces in communities that disproportionately lack resources.

Four playgrounds located in the City’s Environmental Justice Communities—which the city describes as areas of San Francisco having higher pollution and predominately low-income—were identified in 2022 to be renovated in phase one.








## Next Steps






