FUNDING & BACKGROUND

- ◇ 2008 CLEAN AND SAFE NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS BOND PROVIDES \$5-MILLION FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO SF PARK TRAILS.

- ◇ PLANNING PROCESS HAS INCLUDED:
 - ◇ Public Meetings and Presentations before the Parks and Recreation Open Space Advisory Committee (PROSAC)
 - ◇ Precedent Research (GGNRA and Bay Ridge Trail)
 - ◇ Park Project Prioritization, Project Scopes and Cost Estimates
 - ◇ Recreation & Park Commission Presentation and Approval of the Trail Program's Plan
 - ◇ Work with other Park and Stakeholder Organizations

To connect people and neighborhoods to nature and to make natural areas and trails visible, healthy, and safe.




URBAN TRAILS PROGRAM FUNDING



- ◇ 2008 CLEAN AND SAFE NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS BOND PROVIDED \$5-MILLION FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO SF PARK TRAILS.
- ◇ 26 ORIGINAL CANDIDATE PARK SITES IDENTIFIED.
- ◇ 11 PRIORITY SITES WILL RECEIVE FUNDING FOR LIMITED SCOPE PROJECTS: BASIC TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS.
- ◇ RPD IS UNDERTAKING ADDITIONAL FUNDRAISING EFFORTS TO IMPLEMENT MORE COMPLETE IMPROVEMENT SCOPES.
- ◇ RPD IS ALSO UNDERTAKING GRANT WRITING EFFORTS, AS WELL AS WORKING WITH NON-PROFIT PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS TO HELP LEVERAGE BOND FUNDS.











A male Mission Blue (*Gloria scarlodes missionensis*)
resting on its host plant, silver lupine (*Lupinus albifrons*)

What is it ?

- The Mission blue butterfly is a federally endangered species.
- These animals are very rare and can **ONLY** be found in a small number of grasslands in Marin, on San Bruno Mountain and here on Twin Peaks!

Why is it here ?

- Mission blues depend on the natural areas of Twin Peaks to survive.
- They need open grasslands, native vegetation and sunny, wind-protected slopes.

What is it doing ?

- From spring to early summer, Mission blues emerge as adult butterflies and drink the nectar of native wildflowers such as coast buckwheat, California phacelia, yarrow and checkerbloom.
- They lay their eggs on lupines, which are the host plants for the Mission blue.
- During fall and winter, the butterfly larvae remain dormant underground.
Any soil disturbance during this season can seriously harm the butterflies!

How can I help ?

- Do your part to protect the butterflies by treading lightly in this area.
- **STAY ON DESIGNATED PATHS** - Do not trample vegetation.
- **NO BIKES ON THIS TRAIL** - Ride bikes on paved paths and roadways only.
- **KEEP PETS ON LEASH** - Prevent pets from digging or defecating here.

CONCEPTUAL PROJECT GOALS



- ◇ ENHANCE TRAIL CONNECTIONS AND REPAIR/REPLACE DEGRADED TIMBER STEPS.
- ◇ ADDRESS EROSION TRAILS AND REPAIR/RESTORE ERODED AREAS.
- ◇ IMPROVE ENTRY AREAS/SIGNAGE AND REPAIR/REPLACE ROADWAY BARRIERS.
- ◇ CONSOLIDATE REDUNDANT TRAIL ALIGNMENTS .
- ◇ ENHANCE HABITAT QUALITY WITH RESTORATION PLANTING AND INVASIVE PLANT CONTROL.



CONSTRUCTION BUDGET AND SCHEDULE



TOTAL PROJECT BUDGET:

- ◇ \$600,000 FROM CLEAN & SAFE NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS BOND
- ◇ \$131,000 FROM HABITAT CONSERVATION FUND GRANT

SCHEDULE (TENTATIVE)

- ◇ PLANNING: 10/2011 – 12/2011
 - KICK OFF MEETING: OCTOBER 5, 2011
 - DESIGN OPTIONS: NOVEMBER 2, 2011
- ◇ DESIGN: 1/2012 – 6/2012
- ◇ BID/AWARD: 7/2012 – 10/2012
- ◇ CONSTRUCTION: 2013
- ◇ HABITAT RESTORATION PLANTING: 2013


