ONE OF THE GREATEST OUTFIELDERS OF MODERN BASEBALL, "YANKEE CLIPPER" BEGAN HIS CAREER WITH SAN FRANCISCO SEALS IN 1932. HIT SAFELY IN 61 CONSECUTIVE GAMES, SETTING A PACIFIC COAST RECORD. JOINED NEW YORK YANKEES IN 1936. IN 1941 SET ALL-TIME MAJOR LEAGUE CONSECUTIVE GAME HITTING STREAK AT 56. HIT 301 HOME RUNS, 8 WORLD SERIES HOMERS. COMPILED A LIFE-TIME AVERAGE OF .325. WAS NAMED AMERICAN LEAGUE MOST VALUABLE PLAYER, 1939, 41, 47 AND HOLDER OF NUMEROUS BATTING AND WORLD SERIES RECORDS. ALL-STAR TEAM CHOICE 1937-43, 1947, 1948. ELECTED TO BASEBALL'S HALL OF FAME, 1955. UNBURIED IN BAY AREA SPORTS HALL OF FAME 1949.
