

Resolution Regarding proposal for Soccer at Kezar

Moved, seconded, and unanimously passed Monday, February 15, 2016.

The Board of Directors of Inner Sunset Park Neighbors has no objection to professional soccer at Kezar Stadium per se, but we must insist that the sponsors and Park & Rec work earnestly with MTA, SFPD Park Station (and other law enforcement and public safety organizations as necessary) to ensure that public safety and quality-of-life concerns are adequately addressed. A preliminary list follows:

- On-duty SFPD staff should not have to bear the burden of controlling crowds leaving the stadium and moving into the adjoining neighborhood seeking food, drink or transportation and of enforcing the 10 PM noise curfew.
- To the greatest extent possible, MTA should supply increased service on all routes in the immediate area as well as increased parking enforcement. Traffic control before and after the matches should be at the expense of the organizers and should not take away from normal on-duty staff.
- All possible off-street parking opportunities shall be investigated by the organizers and made available to the greatest extent possible
- Organizers shall provide stand-by on-site Medical Emergency staff and equipment without diminishing normal on-duty services (EMT, Ambulance, etc.)
- Any alcohol permits issued at the inception of the lease shall be conditional and reviewed after every 5 matches (sooner if neighborhood complaints are traced to alcohol use).
